Not only did the dinner help reach the \$700,000 mark for funds raised through local charity events for diabetes research, but this year's proceeds were donate to the DRI in loving memory of Glen Cover Joe Mansi, who sadly passed away this year at age 77.

Nassau County Legislator and DRIF Board Member Delia DeRiggi- Whitton said she was very grateful that the Cooking for a Cure committee put on a 10th successful evening of gourmet delights at Page One Restaurant, owned by Joe Mansi's daughter Jeanine DiMenna, who has given so much to the Glen Cove community. The event was sponsored in part by Page One Restaurant, which is co-owned and co-operated by Peter Antonopoulos and Chef DiMenna. This year Cooking for a Cure honored Dr. Barbara Keber, associate director of the Family Medicine Residency program at Glen Cove Hospital.

Dr. Keber was recently named Physician of the Year by the Metropolitan New York Association of Diabetes Educators (MNYADE). Dr. Keber was recognized for her expertise, professionalism and creativity in helping individuals with diabetes learn how to effectively manage their disease. Dr. Keber is a team leader and member of the multidisciplinary Task Force for Diabetes Center Accreditation at Glen Cove Hospital. Thanks to the task force's efforts, in 2009, Glen Cove Hospital was the first hospital in New York State to earn advance inpatient diabetes management by The Joint Commission. "Dr. Keber has worked in family medicine and diabetes care management for most of her medical career. Her compassion, caring and commitment to her patients' is admirable. We honor Dr. Keber for her unending dedication and support of those she cares for," said De-Riggi-Whitton.

More Glen Cove College Bound Athletes Commit

This month several Glen Cove High School college-bound student-athletes announced that they would be exhibiting their talents on the playing fields and courts of their respective higher education institutions.

Varsity football players Christian Klimaszewski and Anton Seaman, varsity baseball player Tommy Ziegen and varsity basketball player Franklyn Mickens will all be playing in college next year.

Christian will attend Western New England. A two-year varsity letterman, senior captain and leader of the defense, he led the county in interceptions with six, but statistics do not show the impact Chris had on the team's defense, according to Coach Pete Kopecky. "The team won eight straight games this season, relying on a swarming defense led by Chris, who had a knack for making the big play," said Coach Kopecky. Chris was also a three-sport starter this year, earning All-Conference status in three sports: football, wrestling and lacrosse. "Players like him are the backbone of high school athletic programs," added

Meanwhile, Christian's teammate Anton will play at Division II Long Island University Post. This is an impressive feat considering he only played varsity football during his senior season. Also a three-sport athlete, Anton will play defensive line for the Post Pioneers this fall. "He took the athleticism he developed playing varsity basketball and baseball, combined it with his God given size and agility and earned a starting position with our team," added Coach Koepcky. "Anton was an integral part of the Big Red defense and the team's overall success."

Last month, Big Red varsity football quarterback Will Kassar committed to playing for Sacred Heart University. Teammate Dane Caufield also intends to play college football at a school to be determined.

Tommy announced he will play baseball at Old Westbury next spring. This season, he not only led the team in hitting, but accumulated the highest batting average in Big Red baseball history,

hitting.541, amassing two doubles, three triples and 18 runs batted in. Tommy also scored 19 runs, had seven stolen bases and finished with an equally impressive .600 on base percentage. If that wasn't enough, he even pitched for the team, finishing with a record of 2-3 and a quality 3.20 earned run average (per nine innings). "Tommy was a tremendous asset to our team," said Coach Kevin Nolan. "To excel in the batter's box, on the base paths and on the mound is extremely impressive. Hitting .300 is good; hitting over .500 is lights out!"

Franklyn will take his talents to the hoops at SUNY Purchase next winter. A three-year varsity basketball player, Franklyn led the team in scoring this season and served as co-captain of the first basketball team to win the Conference Championship in over 20 years at Glen Cove High School. "Frankie has always been a dedicated member to the basketball program," said Coach Pete Falen. "His work ethic both on and off the court has been commended by both his teachers and coaches alike. He is a team-first student athlete and is well received by all of his peers."



The owner Bobby Janosick, accompanied by his sister Rachel Janosick and cousin Zachary Harowitz officially opened up shop at the store's grand opening, and hopes to educate people about the process of home brewing.

Mayor Ralph Suozzi attended the Grand Opening, along with the Glen Cove Chamber of Commerce and many other curious citizens looking to both welcome and learn about what the store has to offer. A ribbon cutting ceremony took place as well as official certification of the store's presence in Glen Cove.

Glen Cove Home Brew is the first of its kind not only in Glen Cove and the Gold Coast, but in the whole of Nassau County as well. Its merchandise features many beers and wine brewing kits, as well as fermenters, malts, yeasts, and a variety of flavorings to customize your beer's flavor and experience. Books explaining the process of fermenting as well as how to imitate your own favorite brand of beer are sold as well.

Excited to bring his new store to his own hometown, the owner Bobby Janosick hopes to diversify and bring more people to Glen Cove, as he feels the city is deserving of more attention to the little gems our city has to offer. A brewer himself, Janosick got the idea to educate people about the brewing process after many homemade attempts at creating his own beer.

"My first attempt was awful. My second, much better." He states.

After investing in better equipment and learning more about the process through his own research, he was able to prefect his methods, and felt he needed to share the experience of brewing your own beer. He explains that as a fan of beer, it's worthwhile to veer away from the mainstream tastes of beer to something more rich and unique. The Glen Cove Substance Abuse Free Environment Agency (SAFE, Inc.), the Tobacco Action Coalition of LI (TAC) and the City of Glen Cove, are pleased to announce the expansion of the City's Tobacco Restrictions that were implemented in 2011 to include all of the City's Parks, Beaches and all youth oriented aspects of the Stanco Park.

On Tuesday, July 4, the City launched their Independence from the danger of smoking in the City's outdoor recreational venues as part of their celebration of this very significant National holiday. Once again, the City pro-actively joined the ranks of nearly 400 Municipalities statewide who have established Tobacco Free Outdoor Policies to protect their residents, employees, and the environment from the dangers of Second-hand Smoke, Cigarette Litter, and helping to change the social norms associated with the acceptability of tobacco use.

The Tobacco Action Coalition (TAC) is one 34 Community Partnerships funded by the NYS Department of Health's Tobacco Control Program working on the Tobacco Free Outdoor Initiative. Under this initiative, TAC is working with businesses and community organizations to implement voluntary entryway bans, as well as educating local municipalities about the benefits of

adopting tobacco use regulations for outdoor recreational areas such as playgrounds, parks and beaches. In addition to the technical support, TAC provides free signage. Therefore, this was a real win-win for the City and the residents in adopting policy to protect the community at no cost to the taxpayer.

With the mission of eliminating alcohol, tobacco, and substance abuse in Glen Cove, SAFE, Inc has been successfully serving their community since 1982 as the only alcohol and substance abuse prevention, intervention and education agency in Glen Cove, and shares many of the same concerns as TAC; most notably, keeping our young people free from the dangers of tobacco use and second-hand smoke. SAFE, with their long-standing excellent reputation in the City was the ideal partner for this venture.

After the success of their efforts to post signage to communicate the pilot project at Dennis Brain Murry and Stanco Park's Playgrounds and Danis Pocket Park Mayor Ralph Suozzi and the entire City Council along with Dr. Sharon Harris, Executive Director of Glen Cove SAFE, Inc. and Carol Meschkow, Nassau Coordinator for the Tobacco Action Coalition were eager to further that policy work that was realized two years

"It was an absolute pleasure to work with Mayor Suozzi, Dr. Harris SAFE, Inc., and Darcy Belyea the City's Recreation Director, who all feel passionately about protecting the citizens of their fair City," stated Mrs. Meschkow. Dr. Sharon Harris, Executive Director of Glen Cove SAFE, Inc. with their long-standing excellent reputation in the City, to partner in this initiative.

"The Tobacco Action Coalition is most concerned about changing the social norms regarding tobacco use and protecting our next generation from the dangers of Second-hand Smoke, especially children. Their lungs are still maturing and smaller, and subsequently they breathe in 50 percent more air than an adult, making them more vulnerable to the dangers of tobacco smoke.

SAFE's mission to keep Glen Cove safe and protect our young people from the negative consequences of alcohol and substance abuse can't be accomplished in a vacuum. The value of community partnerships is imperative to our work here at SAFE, Inc. and on behalf of the Board of Directors and staff of SAFE we are grateful to have this effective collaboration to accomplish this goal.

On behalf of the City, "we are appreciative of the support that both TAC and SAFE, Inc. have provided in accom-

plishing this Smoke Free Outdoor Air Initiative, and welcome this next step in keeping our parks clean and safe," commented Darcy Belyea, Director of the City of Glen Cove Parks & Recreation Department who is working with the Coalition and SAFE on selecting sites to post additional signage in the new locations

The relationship between the three entities has expanded beyond the Smoke Free Outdoor Initiate to working with the local school district on the states Point-of –Sale "Seen Enough Tobacco" campaign to help prevent the next generation of from becoming replacement smokers. Hopefully, said Ms. Meschkow "we can parlay on our strong bond and devotion for the community to include Smoke Free Housing Options for the City residents as well in the coming year."

TAC and SAFE are both delighted, and commend Mayor Ralph Suozzi and the City Council for their outstanding efforts to broaden their policy to include all of their majestic parks an beaches situated along the Islands famed gold coast.



Name the Celebrity



This week's celebrity was born in Boston, Mass. on Sept. 17, 1904. He was an Italian-American comedian, singer, songwriter, and a trombonist. He is probably best remembered as the zaniest of Bob Hope's sidekicks of Hope's popular radio shows and films of the 1940's and '50's. He was also along on many of Hope's USO trips to entertain the troops over the years. He started his career as a trombonist in orchestras and dance bands in and around his native Boston. During the 1930's, he played with the CBS house orchestra, the Columbia Symphony Orchestra, and developed a reputation for prankishness. In an opera parody, he hollered an aria "in a deadpan screech" that became his trademark on Bob Hope's shows. He was one of the three memorable discoveries from the 1940's Big Crosby Kraft Music Hall shows. The others were pianist, comedian, Victor Borge and drummer, music "depreciationist" Spike Jones. Our celebrity had the ability to stretch a single word to extreme lengths. In addition to songs (such as "Aaaaaaaaaaaaall..."), he worked this bit into Hope and Crosby's "Road to Singapore" (1940) and "Road to Rio" (1947).

Last Week's Celebrity

Last week's celebrity was Ann Doran. Born in Amarillo, Texas on July 29, 1911, she worked from stand-in to incidental supporting player. While at Columbia Pictures, she was a favorite of Frank Capra's and worked in many of his productions. She continued to work, mostly on TV, until shortly before her death of natural causes at 89 years old in 2000. She bequeathed \$400,000 to the Motion Picture Country House, the retirement home for the movie industry.
