
Echausse West Point Graduate

Glen Cove IAC Holds Monthly Meeting at Library

The Glen Cove Interagency Council (IAC) recently held its monthly meeting at the Glen Cove Library. Library Director Kathie Flynn and her staff gave an overview of the many services available at the library.

The Glen Cove Library has an extensive collection of historical documents and photos. The collection began with a donation from Robert Coles, after whom the library's history room is dedicated. Staff is currently augmenting the collection by conducting oral histories of Glen Cove. The collection, which includes interviews with former mayors, is called "Voices of Glen Cove".

The library also has an active teen program. Approximately 20-30 teens meet monthly. They perform community service, work with younger readers, and enjoy teen-related programs and lectures. The teens also participate in the "Any Solder" program, packing and sending donated supplies to US troops in Afghanistan.

The library has been busy reaching out to the Spanish speaking community. A native speaker makes presentations to ESL students and their parents and participates in World Book Night, distributing books to students and signing them up for library cards. The library also conducts computer classes in Spanish and offers a Spanish language story hour

for younger children.

The library offers special programs for all ages. Adults can enjoy book discussions, musical performances, educational lectures, computer classes, career assistance and more. The Children's Department offers programs for younger readers including story time four times a week, arts and crafts, music and movement, a Lego club and a summer reading club. Given the current emphasis on STEM-related programs, staff has been offering more activities related to science and technology.

Library staff also bring the library out into the community. Staff make presentations at local schools, have an ongoing outreach program at the Glen Cove Day Care Center and share a historical slide show with residents at local assisted living facilities and nursing homes.

The Glen Cove IAC includes community leaders representing a variety of human and social service agencies throughout Glen Cove. It reflects Glen Cove's rich cultural, religious and ethnic diversity and meets regularly to identify and address changing needs in the community. This network has resulted in numerous projects and collaborations that benefit Glen Cove residents on a daily basis. For more information about IAC, please visitiacglencove.org.







Name the Celebrity



This week's celebrity was one of the original cast members of TV's very first space opera, "Captain Video & His Rangers." He was one of WABD/WNEW NY TV 5's most well-known and beloved cartoon show emcees. He was born in Dayton, Ohio on June 25, 1920 and served in the US Army medical corps during WWII. After his service overseas, he began a career in show business working as an actor in summer stock theater in Ohio, appearing in Noel Coward plays. He would soon leave the theater for a more stable career in radio as an announcer working for local stations in Ohio. He eventually moved to NY where he worked in radio and in 1946 made the move to TV when he joined experimental station W2XJT in NY. Two years later he joined WABD-TV 5, the NYC flagship station of the now forgotten Dumont Network. He worked at Channel 5 as a staff announcer for many years often hosting numerous film shorts, such as "Dick Tracy." He also did commercial plugs for many sponsors but he was best remembered for his work on kids' TV. In 1949, he began his role as announcer "Ranger Rogers", who introduced reruns of old movie westerns in "Captain Video and His Video Rangers". He lasted until the "Capt. Video" series ended in May 1955. In an interview with former Ch. 5 WNEW entertainment (pre-WNYN & pre-Fox 5), critic and newsman, Stewart Klein, on his late night talk show, "Off the Set" in 1984, our celebrity, together with fellow period emcees Sandy Becker and Sonny Fox, explained that the old westerns were screened so that the writers wouldn't have to script complete episodes of "Capt. Video." At the time, our celebrity was known for using his appearances on "Capt. Video" as a means to tell his parents back in Dayton, Ohio about his new-born son, who presently lives in Oyster Bay. He did this everyday on the show much to the displeasure of the network execs and the FCC. I guess they never saw Kathie Lee Gifford coming! He went on to have four more! His announcing role on "Capt. Video" was spoofed by Frank March on "TV or Not TV", the very first episode of Jackie

Gleason's "The Honeymooners" (1955). As an added clue, he wore a bow-tie on all his children's TV shows.

Last week's celebrity was born June Stovenour. She later took the last name of her step-father, Bert Haver. In 1946, she starred and received first billing in "Wake Up and Dream" with John Payne and "Three Little Girls in Blue" with George Montgomery, Celeste Holm and Vera-Ellen. "Three Little Girls" was a remake of Guy Bolton's 1938 play "Three Blind Mice" and 1941's movie musical "Moon Over Miami" with Betty Grable. Its score featured songs with music by Josef Myrow and lyrics by Mack Gordon and is notable for the first appearance of the classic "You Make Me Feel So Young", popularized by Frank Sinatra in 1956. Both of her 1946 movies were well received and brought moderate success. The following year, the role of "Katie" was written into the film "I Wonder Who's Kissing Her Now", just for Haver. Possibly best known for her roles in optimistic musicals, her first comedy in 1948, "Scudda Hoo! Scudda Hay!" with Walter Brennan, Natalie Wood and Marilyn Monroe in her earliest speaking role, was a major success. The same year, she starred as Marilyn Miller, a Broadway musical star of the 1920's and '30's, in the bio-musical "Look for the Silver Lining." The following year, she would star in "The Daughter of Rosie O'Grady" and "I'll Get By". In 1951, Haver was again filmed with Fox's newest asset Marilyn Monroe, and previous "Ill Get By" co-star, William Lundigan, in the low budget comedy "Love Nest." Even though Haver was the lead and received top-billing, most of the film's publicity centered around Monroe, who had a minor role and garnered under-the-title billing. Hmmmm, I bet Haver felt like dejavu all over again, right Miss Grable??!! "Love Nest" was Haver's only full-length film in black and white. Her other 15 releases between 1943 and 1953 were shot in three-strip Technicolor, something of a record for a Hollywood Golden Age actress. Her last appearance was as herself on "The Lucy-Desi Comedy Hour" in 1958. At the age of 79, Haver died of respiratory failure on July 4, 2005. She is buried next to her husband, "My Three Sons", "Double Indemnity" and the original "Absent-Minded Professor" actor Fred MacMurray, at Holy Cross Cemetery, in Culver City, California.

I just checked my calendar and sure enough Monday is Bloomsday. I usually celebrate with friends reading excepts of ULYSSES but this year I want to do something a little more special. Any thoughts?

Dear Bloomsday Celebrant,

I have a wonderful plan for you which will begin on the eve of Bloomsday. As most of my readers know, Bloomsday is celebrated every year to commemorate the day James Joyce's ULYSSES takes place: June 16, 1904. Joyce spent most of his adult life in exile but he wrote obsessively about one place and one place only: his birthplace - Dublin. In UL-YSSES, we follow three main characters through the day into the night- seeing and experiencing Dublin as they did. But ULYSSES is more than the portrait of one city on one day- it is also a study of the epic wanderings of the Greek hero Odysseus (Ulysses)- mocking the wanderings of the most unlikely of heroes:

Leopold Bloom. On Sunday, June 15 at 8am, the James Joyce Society of Sea Cliff will lead a tour of Sea Cliff/Dublin stopping at parallel locations along the way. The tour will begin at the Sea Cliff Water Tower (Martello Tower). Other places will include Still Partners (Davey Byrne's Pub), Headless Park (Nelson's Pillar), Memorial Park (Dublin Cemetery), K.C. Gallagher's (Barney Kiernan's Bar) and Sea Cliff Beach (Sandymount Strand). Dan and Ann DiPietro will lead the tour which will take about one hour. In preparation you might want to read ULYSSES AND US by Declan Kieberd, FOUR DUBLIN-ERS by Richard Ellmann, or the recently released THE MOST DANGEROUS BOOK by Kevin Birmingham. 




