Working on Our Waters

Officials Announce Investment for Crescent Beach and Sea Cliff

A major step forward was announced this week for re-opening Crescent Beach and protecting our waters in general when officials gathered to discuss a \$2 million Nassau County investment that will study sewering Crescent Beach and Sea Cliff Avenue.

Nassau County owns a sewer system that serves a significant percentage of residents and businesses. For many years, officials have been discussing expanding the system to stimulate muchneeded economic growth and home value, and also remedy pollution and health concerns affecting Glen Cove, Sea Cliff and the greater Hempstead Harbor / Oyster Bay / Long Island Sound area.

In Glen Cove, the water at Crescent beach has been contaminated for years as a result of faulty septic systems at one, or a handful, of the roughly 75 residential properties in the nearby community. This has resulted in one of Glen Cove's only beaches being closed to bathing to the city's 30,000 residents for five consecutive summers. Further, the greater Hempstead Harbor / Oyster Bay / Long Island sound shell-fishing and general revitalization efforts are being thwarted by this known source of consistent water

Nassau County's Department of Health (DOH) tried to work locally with the City of Glen Cove to study the cesspools that could be causing this large environmental / health issue. The final determination by The Nassau County DOH was that the only true solution would be

to add these homes to the Nassau County sewer system.

The North Shore Historical Museum Names Its Building The Marguerite & Joseph Suozzi Building

Last fall, the North Shore Historical Museum embarked on a Naming Opportunities Campaign, offering friends of the Museum opportunities to contribute funds in exchange for the dedication of unique parts of the Museum building.

The Board of Trustees is delighted to announce that, in response to this campaign, a generous gift from the friends and family of Marguerite and Joseph Suozzi will result in dedicating the historic 1907 Courthouse building to them. The Suozzis are well known to the community served by the Museum. Both Marge and Joe have devoted a significant part of their lives to the betterment of the North Shore.

The Honorable Joseph A. Suozzi was born in Italy and has lived out the American dream of achievement and public service. He attended St. Patrick's School in Glen Cove and St. Dominic's High School in Oyster Bay. After majoring in education at Fordham University, he enlisted in the Air Force. As a navigator on a B-24 plane in World War II, he flew 35 missions, earning the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal and three Oak Leaf Clusters. After the war, he attended Harvard Law School on the G.I. Bill, graduating in 1948. He became the law partner of Mayor Luke Mercadante and, in 1949, at the age of 28, he was elected aJudgeoftheCityCourtofGlenCove, theyoungestjudgeeverelectedinNew York State. He was elected for 2 terms as Mayor of Glen Cove, and to two 14 year terms as Justice of the New York State Supreme Court. During his second term, he was appointed as an Associate Justice of the Appellate Division. He eventually became a senior partner in the law firm of Meyer, Suozzi, English and Klein.

Marguerite Holmes Suozzi was born in Queens. She studied nursing at Mary Immaculate Hospital in Jamaica and worked as an operating room nurse at Glen Cove Community Hospital after herfamily moved to Sea Cliff. She met her future husband on the eve of his installation as City Court Judge and they were married 4 years later. They are the parents of 5 children, 14 grandchildren, and 3 great-grandchildren. In addition to her duties as a wife, daughter, daughterin-law and mother, she has been an avid devotee and supporter of the political campaigns of her husband and her son, Tom, who served four terms as Glen Cove Mayor and two terms as Nassau

County Executive. An enthusiastic gardener and championgolfer, shehas also been active in the AARP, Girl Scouts, St. Patrick's R.C. Church and most notably, the Morgan Park Summer Music Festival. She has chaired this hugely popular event for over 50 years. Working with a committee of local volunteer residents, Marge has presented programs ranging from opera, ballet and Broadway musicals to swing, jazz and military bands.

The Museum is planning a series of events on Sunday, August 3, beginning at 3 PM, when the Plaque naming the building will be unveiled. S p e c i a 1 guests and the public are invited to attend the ceremony at the Court building at 140 Glen Street in Glen Cove.

In recognition of Mrs. Suozzi's 50 year leadership of the Morgan Park Concerts, the public is invited to bring a picnic to Morgan Park after the ceremony to join in the festivities. A band concert will follow. Brian Mercadante, President of the Museum, when announcing this event, said that he is "anticipating that this gift will form the cornerstone of an endowment fund that will ensure the continued viability of the Museum and will enhance its presence in the North Shore community".

So, it is great news that Nassau County has committed to funding a feasibility study for the installation of public sanitary sewers in the North Shore area. A modern sewer system, in place of an aging septic system, will help eliminate bacterial intrusion in the local waters.

'It's important that we reopen Crescent Beach so that it once again serves as a beautiful destination for families. seniors and beachgoers," said County Executive Mangano. "The installation of sewers in this North Shore is an important public health initiative as it will protect the local environment and improve the Long Island Sound so that our recreational fishermen and residents can rely on these waters for enjoyment and business alike. I thank Mayor Spinello for his commitment to this project and for dedicating the resources necessary to identify which sewered areas should be incorporated into the County's sewage collection.'

Legislator Delia DeRiggi-Whitton said she has worked on getting this project since her first day in office and was glad to help get things moving forward. She said, "Since being elected, having Crescent Beach be reopened has been one of my top priorities. This is the beach I brought my own children to when they were small, and I hope these actions the County is taking today will help to ensure that Crescent Beach is enjoyed for many generations to come."

Additionally, Glen Cove Mayor Reggie Spinello has been working on his own initiative regarding Crescent Beach. The City of Glen Cove is doing testing and legislation.

Mayor Spinello stated, "Once again County Executive Mangano has responded to my request for assistance in Glen Cove. Immediately after meeting with the County Executive and his staff to explain the inherent problems in the area surrounding Crescent Beach, the County laid the ground work for a longterm solution to our problem. This study, along with the supporting testing the City is providing and our new legislation regarding septic systems, will result in a marked improvement in the water quality in our area. I thank County Executive Mangano, Congressman Israel, Senator Marcellino, Assemblyman Lavine and Legislator DeRiggi-Whitton for their support and assistance in this matter."

In Sea Cliff, the main strip of restaurants and shops on Sea Cliff Avenue, is out of room for cesspools. The lack of

any room for new systems makes any further economic development impossible and is even hurting existing establishments.

Connecting sewers and retiring old septic systems would be not only offer economic virtues, but would serve environmental and health interests. Ideally, waste should be sent through a treatment plant. Currently, a lot of waste is going into the soil, with indeterminate amounts making its way into our harbor.

The Village of Sea Cliff has had an existing design and possible funding for Sea Cliff Avenue, requiring a relatively small amount of additional funding to complete the project. So it is wonderful news that Nassau County is committing funding to getting this project going.

"This vital \$2 million investment will ensure that Sea Cliff Avenue, the Village of Sea Cliff's main strip of businesses, will be accounted for in this environmental project. I thank County Executive Mangano and Congressman Israel for their work in forming partnerships to find a comprehensive and common sense solution to this issue," said Sea Cliff Mayor Bruce Kennedy.

Congressman Steve Israel stated, "Crescent Beach is a true treasure for the City of Glen Cove and for too long has been contaminated and unsafe for residents to swim and enjoy. I want to thank this bipartisan and diverse coalition of elected officials who have joined me in working tirelessly on finding a comprehensive solution to this issue and County Executive Ed Mangano for providing a \$2 million investment in the future of this treasured natural resource."

"This study is a positive step in maintaining the natural beauty and resources of the waterfront. With the hard work of Nassau County Executive Ed Mangano we will finally be able to formulate a solution to the problems associated with Crescent Beach and get this cherished area open to the public once and for all," said Senator Carl L. Marcellino.

State Assemblyman Charles Lavine stated, "For far too long, Crescent Beach has been unavailable for use by the residents of the Glen Cove community. Understanding the problems that exist here and undertaking the effort necessary to ensure the environment is protected is a vitally important step in reclaiming the beach. I am very grateful for the County's role in this effort and I am pleased to play a meaningful role."



Best Selling Author Helps Aspiring Book Authors on Long Island

"I started out with just self-published ebook and a simple blog..." Ron Douglas says about his initial journey into sharing his expertise in print. Little did he know that his little side project would evolve into a multiple-book deal with publishing powerhouse Simon & Schuster and over 1.2 million books sold worldwide.

NY Times Best Selling Author Ron Douglas has opened Publishing Etc., a full service book publishing, marketing, and consulting business located in Scoopy Doo Plaza at 175 Forest Ave in Locust Valley. Douglas says his goal with Publishing Etcetera is to help clients get published in order to share their message, talents, and expertise with the world.

In 2004, while working for JP Morgan, Douglas started a blog and free email newsletter at RecipeSecrets.net to share his recipes Online. He was looking for a way out of the corporate grind in order to spend more time with his two kids Nia and Ryan.

Douglas says, "When I was working 60 hours per week on Wall St., the best part of my day was coming home and hearing my daughter's beautiful little voice say "Daddy's Home!" I promised her that one day soon Daddy was going

to be home with her all the time." Having grown up in a single-parent household himself, he was motivated to find a way to support his family by working from home.

Over time Douglas built a large following on RecipeSecrets.net which resulted in a huge demand for him to self-publish a cookbook. He launched America's Most Wanted Recipes containing 135 "copycat recipes" which were his reverse-engineered instructions for recreating popular dishes from 57 different restaurants including Red Lobster, Applebees, The Cheesecake Factory, Olive Garden, TGI Fridays, and Outback Steakhouse.

The cookbook was so well received that he sold over 60,000 self-published copies Online over the next few years. Douglas' hobby website and cookbook eventually got the attention of the media with an appearance on Fox News featuring his version of KFC's Original Chicken. That interview lead to a book deal with Simon & Schuster and many more media appearances including Good Morning America, Home Shopping Network, ABC, NBC, People Magazine, and Today Show Australia.

Today Douglas has published five

books in the "America's Most Wanted Recipes" series, which have cumulatively sold over 1.2 million copies. His latest book America's Most Wanted Recipes, Kids Menu Edition is scheduled to be published in September of 2014. According to Douglas –

"Book publishing changed my life and now I want to give back by helping others do the same. There's no better way to establish credibility for your business or personal brand than to become an author. Most people don't realize that you can get started by publishing an ebook and selling it Online in Amazon.com's Kindle store. You can also get a self-published paperback book printed for about \$3 per book.

For those who want to publish a book but don't have the time to write it, we offer ghostwriting services whereby a professional writer will interview you and organize your thoughts into a 'done for you' book with you as the sole author."

With the success of books like 50 Shades of Grey by E.L. James, more and more people are self-publishing Online instead of going the traditional publishing route. According to Forbes.com, "E.L. James single-handedly changed the

industry's view of self-publishing. Her astronomically successful books (which sold over 70 million copies worldwide in 2012) came from a place no publisher would ever look: online fan fiction. After James, publishers could not afford to ignore self-publishing lest they miss the next commercial phenomenon."

And as a sign of the times, about 50% of the sales revenues from the 50 Shades trilogy were from ebooks. According to Jeff Bezos, Founder and CEO of Amazon.com "customers are now choosing Kindle books more often than print books. We had high hopes that this would happen eventually, but we never imagined it would happen this quickly we've been selling print books for 15 years and Kindle books for less than four years." Douglas is certainly on top of this trend and has the experience to make a positive impact helping aspiring authors in our local community. Name the Celebrity



This week's celebrity was born in Chicago, Ill. on Feb. 2, 1923 and was the daughter of stage actors. She made her film debut at the age of nine in "Westward Passage" (1933). Over the next couple of years, she played uncredited supporting roles in such films as "Little Women" (1933) with Katharine Hepburn and Joan Bennet and in "Anne of Green Gables" (1934) with Anne Shirley. She played the role of "Mary" in the film adaptation of Lillian Hellman's 1934 stage play "The Children's Hour". The film was renamed "These Three", a 1936 film that told the story of three adults, played by Miriam Hopkins, Merle Oberon and Joel McCrea. They find their lives almost destroyed by the malicious lies of an evil attention-seeking child. For her role as that child, our celebrity was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Supporting Actress, then the youngest person to be nominated for that award. The film was later successfully remade, under the original stage title and starred Audrey Hepburn, Miriam Hopkins, Shirley MacLaine and James Garner. In 1938, our celebrity starred as the saucy mischievous teenager in the multi-Academy Awards nominated hit comedy film "Merrily We Live" with Billie Burke, Brian Ahern and Tom Brown, later seen as a character actor in the 1970s, on ABC's "General Hospital", as the hospital's maintenance man, married to "Nurse Lucille". This film was followed by a series of four light-drama films,


where our celebrity played girl detective, "Nancy Drew", based on the books by author Carolyn Keene.

Last Week's Celebrity

Last week's celebrity, Reginald Denny, was not only an English stage, American film, and TV star, but he was an amateur boxing champ of Great Britain, an aviator and a UAV (unmanned aerial vehicles) pioneer. The first large scale production purpose-built drone was the product of our celebrity. He served with the British Royal Flying Corps during WWI, and after the war, immigrated to the U.S. to seek his fortune in Hollywood as an actor. Between acting jobs, he pursued his interest in radio control model aircraft in the 1930s. He and his business partners formed "Reginald Denny Industries" and opened a model plane shop in 1934 on Hollywood Blvd. known as "Reginald Denny Hobby Shops". The shop evolved into the "Radioplane Co.". Denny believed that the low cost RC aircraft would be useful for training anti-aircraft gunners, and in 1935, he demonstrated a proto-type target drone, the RP-1, to the U.S. Army. He then bought a design from Walter Righter in 1938 and began marketing it to the Army as the RP-2, and after modifications, as the RP-3 and RP-4 in 1939. In 1940, he and his partners won an Army contract for their radio controlled RP-4, which became the Radioplane OQ-2. They manufactured nearly fifteen thousand drones for the Army during WWII. It was at the Van-Nuys Radioplane factory that in 1944 that an Army photographer, David Conover, assigned by Denny's friend, Army publicist and future U.S. President, Capt. Ronald Regan, saw a young lady named Norma Jeane, and thought she had potential as a model. This "discovery" lead to fame for Jeane, who soon changed her name to Marilyn Monroe. Mr. Denny died on June 16, 1967, at age 75, after suffering a stroke while visiting his native Britain.
