








North Shore Honors Kiwanis Student of the Month Carolina Pardo

Glen Cove student signs letter of intent

Glen Cove High School senior Taylah Hudson has signed a Letter of Intent to play Division I basketball at Texas Southern University.

"I've been playing my whole life for this moment," Hudson said. "I hope I can contribute to the team."

Hudson, who received a full scholar-ship to Texas Southern, has been playing varsity basketball since grade seven. She has been honored twice as an All-County Player by the coaches in Nassau County and was named Conference Player of the Year in 2013. She was also designated as an All-State Player by the Sportswriter's Association of New York and named to the Basketball Coaches' Association of New York Section 8 All-Star Team.

Varsity Girls Basketball Coach Greg Mayerhoffer said Hudson reached a milestone in her career last season, when she became the all-time scoring leader in the history of the girls program at Glen Cove. Ultimately, she went on to surpass the 1000-point total, an achievement accomplished by very few student-athletes in the sport.

Superintendent of Schools Maria Rianna, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction and Technology Dr. Michael Israel, Athletic Director Denise

Kiernan, Glen Cove High School Interim Principal Roseann Cirnigliaro and guidance counselor Christine Mulhall offered their congratulations to Hudson at a recent celebration held in her honor. "I'm so happy for her," Mulhall said. "She has a great work ethic whether it's at school or on the court and is a great role model for younger girls."

Taylah's father, Glen Cove High School Assistant Principal Allen Hudson, expressed his pride in his daughter's success.

"Anyone that meets her knows how humble she is, "Hudson said. "She always thinks about her teammates first." Coach Mayerhoffer agreed, and said Hudson would always be regarded as one of the very best to ever play basketball in Nassau County and New York State.

"I've coached so many good players over the years, but she's the best," he said. "I have no doubt she will be successful in the next stage of her life, but I'm sad to see her leave."

Hudson said she hopes to contribute to the team at Texas Southern University.


American Legion Reaches Out


GWL Third Graders Participate in a Dissection & Utilize Stereo-Microscopes

Mrs. Maryalice Kelly joined Mrs. Darlene Skaee's 3rd grade class to conclude the Food Web unit by dissecting an Owl Pellet. The 3-day lesson was an amazing experience where the students used the outdoor classroom while they dissected, analyzed and sorted bones from an Owl Pellet. The students used Stereo-Microscopes to help analyze and identify the bone structures. Then, the children were able to collect numerical data from their findings and incorporate it into their math lessons.

Once the children recorded their

numerical data in a data table, they were introduced to using the data to generate graphs. Mrs. Kelly said, "The students were so excited when they were able to analyze their graphs and make sense of their discoveries using their newly found math skills."

Dear Great Book Guru,

With temperatures in the 60's, it certainly doesn't feel like December, but the coming weeks will certainly be filled with winter fun, beginning with the Tree Lighting on Sunday, December 7 at 5pm on the Village Green. Last week I read a mystery you recommended somehow winter nights cry out for a good mystery- and I would love to read another - something short but heavy into character. Any thoughts? Mystery Maven

Dear Mystery Maven,

One of the most revered mystery writers of the last fifty years, P.D. James died this week so I think it fitting to recommend one of her classic works: AN UNSUITABLE JOB FOR A WOMAN. Featuring the indomitable Cordelia Gray, a young English woman, who in the opening chapter inherits a rather shabby detective agency on the outskirts

of London. Her first case involves the death of a young Cambridge student Mark Callendar, son of a wealthy, aristocratic scientist. As in all James's novels, it is the descriptions of place and characternot the plot or crime- that capture the reader's attention. Gray's struggles with class obsessed witnesses and sexist colleagues make this 264 page book so much more than a quick mystery, and the intrigues of university life and village politics elegantly overshadow the details of the actual murder. Recommended!

Melodies carried the words, bringing the characters to life, enabling them to give passionate, transcendent performances to the grateful audience.

If you missed this fine production, don't fret. You will get another chance. Liberty deserves a bigger venue. It re-enforces the ideals of liberty, freedom, and opportunity that make Americans proud. The melting pot concept was explained by the sculptor to his little Liberty, as something like bouillabaisse. I agree, and like the French fish soup, Liberty is hearty peasant faire...for pleasing and nourishing the quintessential spirit of America.

Superintendent's Conference Day held in Glen Cove

Teaching professionals from the Glen Cove City School District received professional development when they attended Superintendent's Conference Day on Nov. 4.

As part of the day's events, teachers attended workshops focusing on a variety of topics, including differentiated instruction and the development of parallel ELA and math questions to mirror state assessments.

Carol Varsalona, an independent ELA consultant and former director of language arts and testing in West Babylon School District, trained ELA teachers from grades 6-8 and social studies teachers from grade 8, in a workshop entitled, "Close Reading Across the Disciplines."

"My goal is to get the teachers more comfortable with the practices and protocol that are inherent in the Common Core so they can ratchet up instruction for students," Varsalona said.

She added that ongoing professional development and collaboration between colleagues was vital to student success.

"Without support and collaboration teachers will feel isolated from the message of the State Education Department to power up instruction, " Varsalona said. "Today's focus is on scaffolding instruction for all learners. I want them to bring passion to their instruction, to teach in the moment."

teachers Meanwhile. elementary Jennifer Russo, Meryl Gordon, Cyndi Van Ommeren and Mark Glaviano unpacked "Go Math" for their colleagues after attending a Nassau BOCES workshop on the math program.

"We focused on breaking into small groups and teaching to the level that each student needs," Russo said. "We also discussed how to utilize all the components of the program to help provide successful instruction."

Other training provided to teachers focused on writing as well as word

study and science. The district also offered workshops on "Nonviolent Crisis Intervention" and "How to Deal with Difficult People," which was facilitated by Brad Withers of Skill Path.



LIBERTY (A Monumental New Musical) Book and Lyrics by Dana Leslie Goldstein

Music by Jon Goldstein Review by Steve Sloane

Jon Goldstein of Glen Cove is prolific. His latest production, Liberty, a Monumental Musical just finished a successful extended run at Theater 80, on the lower East-Side. Jon wrote the music. His sister, Dana Leslie Goldstein wrote the book and lyrics.

Liberty opened with a French sculptor putting the finishing touches on a little girl version of the Statue of Liberty. Imagine that.

The story grew into a fascinating history lesson. Characters were introduced and the music defined them. I learned that when the statue arrived in NY, the budget for its pedestal had been vetoed by President Grover Cleveland from 1884's recession budget. Go know!

In the course of the play I was introduced to larger than life American heroes like Emma Lazarus, the poet who wrote the famous inscription, "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses, yearning to be free..." Considering the controversy with immigration here, in France and all over the world, this theme remains urgent, one hundred and thirty years later.

Joseph Pulitzer, who published the New York World, was performed with bravura. He had the entrepreneurial brilliance to fund Liberty's pedestal with a precursor of today's crowd-source funding. He offered to print the name of every contributor, no matter how small their donation. This kick-started a social movement and expanded his readership, because as he astutely predicted, everybody who gave would buy the paper to see their name in print.

Political balance was achieved by a "work for pay" politician, named Walker. His anti-immigration policy was presented with great voice. His dignity and logic might inspire more intelligent oratory from present day conservatives.

There was great humor in one scene when an Irish immigrant and a Jewish immigrant compare notes about how bad it was for them. The Irishman says that the potatoes that survived the blight were rotten. The Jew says, "You had potatoes?" The Irishman says, that he stowed away in the cargo hold of the ship, sleeping with rats. The Jew says, "You had rats?" The show was rich with humor, never cruel or belittling, always respectful and fair. That is an accomplishment in itself. The music was delightful and seemed

The music was delightful and seemed effortless, with characters naturally erupting into song. Every actor was polished. Every voice well trained. I could understand every word. Timing was impeccable. Kudos go to the director, Evan Pappas. The cast moved briskly, with never a dull moment as scenes changed without missing a beat. There were seventeen songs with titles like "We Had It Worse", a scene to which



Name the Celebrity



This celebrity was born on Aug. 21, 1898 in St. Helen's, Merseyside, England. He had one of those character faces that one would recognize but not necessarily know his name. He was a short, blubbery-jowled Hollywood character actor of the 1930s with prior experience in the United Kingdom theatre and cinema. He was a member of the Royal Navy during WWI. He first travelled to America on Dec. 18, 1923 for a series of theatrical engagements in NYC. His big break as an actor came with Gertrude Lawrence and Beatrice Lillie in "Charlot's Revue" in 1925. Some of his notable roles were as "Barkis" in "David Copperfield" (1935) with Freddie Bartholomew and Edna May Oliver, as "Grove" in "Dangerously Yours" (1933) with Warner Baxter, as "Larsen" in "Shanghai Madness" (1933) with Spencer Tracy and Fay Wray, as "Baxter" in Warner Oland's "Charlie Chan's Secret" (1936) and "Smith" in "The Mutiny on the Bounty" (1935) with Charles Laughton, Clark Gable and Franchot Tone.

Last Week's Celebrity

Born Lewis Delaney Offield, last week's celebrity was Jack Oakie. His father was a grain dealer and his mother a psychology teacher. When he was five years old, the Offield family moved to Muskogee, Oklahoma, the source of his "Oakie" nickname. His adopted first name, Jack, was the name of the first character he played on stage. He also spent time with his grandmother in Kansas City, Missouri. While he was in elementary school, he made spending money as a paperboy for The Kansas City Star. He recalled years later that he made especially good money selling "extras" in Nov. 1916, during the re-election of President Woodrow Wilson.

Some of his other film roles were as "Luke" in "The Toast of New York" (1937) with Cary Grant and Frances Farmer, as "Lanny Morgan" in two of the "Annabel" comedy series films (1937 and '38) with Lucille Ball and as "Shorty Hoolihan" in "The Call of the Wild" (1935) with Clark Gable and Loretta Young. According to Judy Lewis, this is the film that united her biological parents Gable & Young, which resulted in her secret birth and "adoption" by Loretta Young. All done to protect careers.

Later in Oakie's career, he appeared in several TV shows including "The Real McCoys", "Bonanza", and "Daniel Boone". In 1950, Jack and his wife, Victoria, acquired Barbara Stanwyck's former "Marwyck" estate where they planted a citrus orchard and bred Afghan hounds. After his death, due to an aortic aneurysm, on Jan. 23, 1978, his wife continued to live on the estate but bequeathed it to the University of Southern California upon her death.




