## Glen Cove Cheerleaders Place Second in Competition



It was announced today that Glen Cove businessman Jim Coniglione has entered into a development deal with the Best Entertainment Group for a reality show based on his pet waste removal business on Long Island, and also for a scripted comedy show created by Mr. Coniglione with writers Frederick Stroppel and Anne Louise Bono.

Jim Coniglione is the owner of Scoopy-Doo Dog Waste Removal Service, which operates out of Glen Cove with offices in Locust Valley, and services homes and estates in Long Island and Westchester counties in the tri-state area. The success of Scoopy-Doo, and his YouTube channel "King of Poop TV"

has brought Mr. Coniglione national media attention including profiles in the Wall Street Journal, the New York Times and the Huffington Post. His outsized, effervescent Italian-American personality and no-holds-barred bravado is tailor-made for the small screen.

Russell Best, Managing Partner of Best Entertainment Group, Inc. is a well-respected veteran of the TV and Entertainment Industry. He started his career at CBS in 1982 and moved on to FOX/Twentieth Television in 1996 to become VP/Executive in Charge of FOX East Coast production. In 1999, he became the Sr. VP/GM of National Recording Studios, Inc., the largest

privately held production facility in the country. In 2002, Russell launched Best Entertainment Group and its subsidiary Brave St. Productions, creating a variety of network programming including reality, documentaries and webisodic content. He produced and sold programming to a myriad of networks including Magic Man (Showtime), This Job's a Trip (Travel Channel), Crash Course in Comedy (Comedy Central), New York Nick (E!), Making the Band with P'Diddy (MTV), Dangerous Minds and Pyramid Code (Documentary Channel) to name a few.

## Cuban Ministry of Culture Offers Historic Invitation to North Shore High School Musicians

North Shore High School will be one of the first public schools to perform in Cuba since the embargo in 1960.

North Shore High School, Glen Head, NY - This February 2016, music students at North Shore High School will be doing something that most Americans haven't been able to do in over half a century fly from New York City to Havana. The historic public school performance tour comes at the threshold of 21st Century global change as Cuba begins to open its doors to the United States. This year, the Music Department at North Shore High School will be one of the first schools in the United States to perform in Cuba since the U.S. lifted the embargo at the end of 2015. Additionally, it comes at the same time as North Shore celebrates its 10th anniversary performance tour. The North Shore band, orchestra, and choral ensembles will be performing in Cuba (approximately 71 students).

"Art has always been part of the vanguard of social change," says Michael Kerschner, Director of Choral Studies. "Part of the mission of our touring program is to be artistic ambassadors between the people of different cultures and nations. This tour is part of a long American tradition where artists encourage diplomatic progress by humanizing events." Mr. Kerschner added, "In Cuba, our students will have the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience Cuba as it transitions into this incredible and new political reality. The fact that these artists are our students makes this tour even more special."

Dalia Rodriguez, North Shore Schools Director of Fine and Performing Arts said, "We're part of a massive historic shift in the world. Our teachers appreciate that the arts draw from so many sources and historical layers. Our students will have the opportunity to understand a country whose music weaves a story of its history." David Soto, Director of High School Bands added, "The fact that we are performing in Cuba is groundbreaking. It amazes me. It's astounding and exciting to be part of a community and administration that supports bold and courageous opportunities for our students."

## The SAFE Glen Cove Coalition coordinates prevention education workshop by Michael's Hope in celebration of National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week

When it comes to teens and drugs it is all about choices and consequences. In honor of National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week the SAFE Glen Cove Coalition's School Committee participated in a week long campaign by creating a program for students at Glen Cove Finley Middle School and Glen Cove High School (GCHS). The School Committee's efforts were targeted at arming students with the facts to help them make the right choices surrounding drugs and alcohol.

National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week was originally launched in 2010 by the National Institute on Drug Abuse as a prevention awareness campaign aimed at educating youth on the facts

surrounding drugs and alcohol. "The school committee understands the importance early on regarding the truth behind drinking and drugging. Teens often don't understand the progressive nature of substance abuse and the long term effects of early use" stated Ashley Ferrufino, SAFE Glen Cove Coalition Liaison.

The campaign included announcements of drug facts every morning during the traditional morning announcements. During health classes at Finley and at GCHS students in health classes played the WreckEd Card game. An educational game that is designed to teach teens to think more introspectively about their decisions regarding drugs and alcohol. This program not only encourages youth to look at their own behavior, but also to reach out and look out for their friends who may be making the wrong unhealthy decisions.

This year GCHS Students had the

opportunity to listen to a nonprofit organization named Michael's HOPE. According to Paul Maffetone the founder of Michael's Hope, the goal of this organization is to present "stories from those who have been directly affected by addiction. We aim to raise awareness of the current epidemic we are living through, how addiction comes to pass for many, and very passionately for us the tremendous hopes of being a helping hand in ending the negative stigma connected to addiction as a whole. We have a saying here at Michael's HOPE which represents everything we stand for: 'The ugliest disease lies in the most beautiful people'."

Speakers Trevor Murray and Jordan Stierle spoke to students about their own struggles with substance abuse, the progressive nature of the disease and living a life of recovery. Both speakers discussed how their own substance use led them to do things they never imagine

doing. The SAFE Glen Cove Coalition facilities these educational presentations within the community in an effort to continue to work to change societal norms about alcohol and substance abuse through ongoing prevention, intervention and education activities and events.

## SCO Family of Services Holds Second Annual Taft Academy



The SCO Taft Academy is a unique professional development initiative for 700 staff from SCO Family of Services working with children and youth with special needs who attend SCO's five residential schools located in Nassau, Suffolk, Queens and Bronx counties. Through an array of staff development opportunities, the SCO Taft Academy advances high quality care for children with developmental vouth disabilities and behavioral challenges, helping them reach the greatest degree of self-sufficiency, family engagement and community integration possible.

SCO held its Second Annual Taft Academy Conference January 26-27, at the New York Institute of Technology in Glen Head, Long Island. Lee Thomas, Emmy award winning broadcaster and author of "Turning White: A Memoir of Change", provided the keynote address. Centered around this year's theme, "Collective Impact: Creating a Positive Ethical Environment," the conference opened with remarks from SCO's Executive Director, Douglas O'Dell who noted:

"We face ethical issues every day. We will engage in a conversation today as to how we can enhance, improve and build upon our established strong ethical foundation."

SCO's Taft Academy enhances staff skills and performance through educationalandprofessionaldevelopment opportunities and establishes a culture of performance excellence through consistent practice and interdisciplinary and collaborative approaches. Building upon the expertise and experiences of staff at each campus, SCO's Taft Academy provides a conduit to sharing and infusing best practices between each residential program and school, as well as among the five campuses. Principals, program directors, direct care workers, psychiatrists, social workers, nurses, teachers and teachers' aides participate in an innovative and collective approach to staff and leadership development and campus-improvement initiatives.

The Taft Academy comprises the following staff development

components:

Classroom Instruction, focused on helping to establish nurturing and responsive relationships that support and advocate for youth served;

Learning Laboratories where staff volunteer to participate in a practicumlike experience on each campus to apply classroom learning to campus-based improvement initiatives;

Online Learning, that reinforces classroom instruction across the five campuses and provides staff with access to 200 course hours of specialized content in the field of developmental disabilities;

Mentorships; and Tuition Assistance.

"The Taft Academy has had the greatest impact on our direct care staff," said Patricia Daniels, Principal of The Christopher School for youth with developmental disabilities, located in the Bronx. "They are provided an opportunity to collaborate with colleagues not only on their own campus but across SCO's five campuses and they come to realize that they are not alone in the daily challenges they face."

"Having a strong ethical standard can always help one to persevere and make the best of any situation," said Melissa Ficara, Special Education Classroom Teacher at the Tyree Learning Center in Sea Cliff, LI.

On Friday, January 29, 2016 Portledge students took a trip to LIU Post to see their work "Outside In" first-hand. "Outside In" is a site specific art installation created by Portledge School students exclusively for the Goldsmith Atrium.


Portledge School is the first school on Long Island to be granted the opportunity of creating a site specific art installation for the Goldsmith Atrium. Art Under Glass, the organization whose mission it is to "present artists and their visions on the Atrium canvas," primarily only works with professional artists.

The cloud themed art installation was conceived of and led by Doris Benter, Department Head for Visual Arts at the Portledge School. Marc Mucciaccio, a recent Portledge School alumni and student at The Bernard and Anne Spitzer School of Architecture, along with current eleventh grade student Antonia Bentel and local architect Peter Bentel,

were instrumental in envisioning the installation of the clouds within the atrium space.

The installation, consisting of over twenty large scale cloud sculptures that are suspended from the Atrium ceiling, has been under construction for the past two years. Students as young as two through fifth grade worked collaboratively on the individual clouds, while connections were nurtured between art, science and grade level curriculums.

Portledge is an independent prenursery to 12th grade school and offers a competitive college preparatory program in a warm, inclusive community where students are inspired to realize their individual potential by developing the critical thinking skills and moral courage necessary for lifelong learning in an increasingly complex world.

Honors students, athletes and even children as young as 12 are experimenting with this highly addictive drug that costs less than a pack of cigarettes to purchase and is growing at an alarming rate on Long Island.

Narcan, or naloxone hydrochloride, is an opiate antidote injection that reverses an opioid overdose. Emergency medical professionals have used Narcan for decades. Now, every Nassau County police officer is trained to administer this live-saving medication. The County has also sponsored Narcan training for over 4,000 civilians in the past three years alone. Dozens of these trainees have already saved the lives of overdosing people.

The latest training session, co-hosted by Nassau County Legislator Delia DeRiggi- Whitton took place on January 27 at North Shore High School in Glen Head. Over 70 attendees received training in how determine whether someone is likely overdosing or not and how to administer Narcan. All attendees left with a complete Narcan kit. Parents who lost their children to heroin overdoses spoke, along with an addict who kicked the habit.

A particularly compelling speaker was RoseMarie Sherry, who took Narcan training just in case she could save someone's life someday, having no idea that she would someday need her kit to save the life of her own son. Ms. Sherry's children were good students and boy scouts who were raised in a good home. So, she is the perfect spokesperson for the, "If it happened in my family, it can happen in anyone's" awareness crusade.


with Deasy Elementary School and other schools in our community to enrich the educational environment," said Sensei Hender, owner of the karate school.





the characters became something of a phenomenon, even releasing an album as "Lenny & the Squigtones", which frequently played on the "Dr. Demento Show" out of Pasadena. Our celebrity also played his character in an episode of "Happy Days". After leaving "Laverne & Shirley" in 1982, he played "David St. Hubbins" in the comedy "This is Spinal Tap" with old pals, Christopher Guest and Harry Shearer.

Having already appeared as a musical guest and then host of "Saturday Night Live", he joined the cast in 1994 and remained until 1995. At the age of 46, he was the oldest person to ever join the "SNL" cast, at the time. His record was later surpassed by Leslie Jones, who joined in 2014, at the age of 47. However, celebrity stills holds the distinction of being the only person to be a musical guest, host and cast member in that order.


#### Last Week's Celebrity

Last week's celebrity was Jon Hart. Although he played mostly minor roles in some fairly well known films, he was probably best known for having replaced Clayton Moore, in 1952, for one season of television series, "The Lone Ranger." Based on the assumption that the masked character, rather than the actor, was the true star of "The Lone Ranger", the program's producers fired Moore, presumably over salary differences, and replaced him with Hart, who was of a similar build and had a comparable background in westerns. However, the public never accepted Hart as "The Lone Ranger" and by 1954, producers returned Moore to the role. According to Clayton Moore's autobiography, "I Was the Masked Man", Moore never knew why he was replaced with Hart and also stated that he had not sought a pay increase.

Hart's last theatrical film appearance was in 1981's "The Legend of the Lone Ranger", in which he appeared as a newspaper editor. He appeared in the TV series "Happy Days" as "The Lone Ranger" in the episode "Hi Yo, Fonzie Away" (Feb. 9 1982), only a short 34 years to the day this columnist is writing this! In this episode, "Fonzie", played by Henry Winkler, gets to meet his childhood hero for his birthday. Mr. Hart passed away on Sept. 20, 2009, at the age of 91, by natural causes.

My family and I are going away for a Presidents' week vacation and I am looking for a book to bring along. With the primary elections so much in the news, I would like to read something with a political twist- preferably nonfiction. Any recommendation?

Obsessed with Presidential Politics

Dear Obsessed,

Daniel DiPietro gave me a fascinating book for my birthday: DARK MONEY by Jane Mayer. Dark money is the term used to describe political spending by groups whose funding does not have to be revealed. Mayer details the enormous power and animus of these American billionaire donors and the subsequent rise of the radical right. She begins with a richly detailed history of the Koch brothers, tracing the family's enormous wealth back to Fred Koch's alliances with Stalin and Hitler in the 1930's. His

sons Charles and David have gone on in a myriad of ways to control not just who rules the country but how the country thinks. In this highly readable account, Mayer underscores the lengths they and their billionaire allies have gone to in order to achieve their goals- whether it be climate change denial, the formation of the Tea Party, or the systematic takeover of local and state governments. DARK MONEY is ultimately a horrifying look at how the United States has been fundamentally and probably irrevocably changed by this billionaire cabal. Highly recommended!






