### City of Glen Cove Receives Approval for Garvies Point Tax Deviations from Nassau County

Following a vote of 13 to 5, the Nassau County Legislature approved a tax deviation for the City's Garvies Point redevelopment project. "I appreciate the support of our County's legislature and I was pleased to see legislators from both parties vote to approve this project. Growing our tax base and bringing jobs to our community shouldn't be a partisan issue," said Mayor Spinello.

The Garvies Point project includes parks, marinas, a public amphitheater, esplanade, stores, restaurants, apartments, and condominiums. Public infrastructure and amenities such as a dog park and amphitheater will be built during the first phase of the project. Bond offerings utilized to fund the public amenities and infrastructures are not City of Glen Cove or IDA debt. Glen Cove taxpayers are not responsible or at risk for the repayment of these bonds. The risks of repayment are exclusively the bond holders.

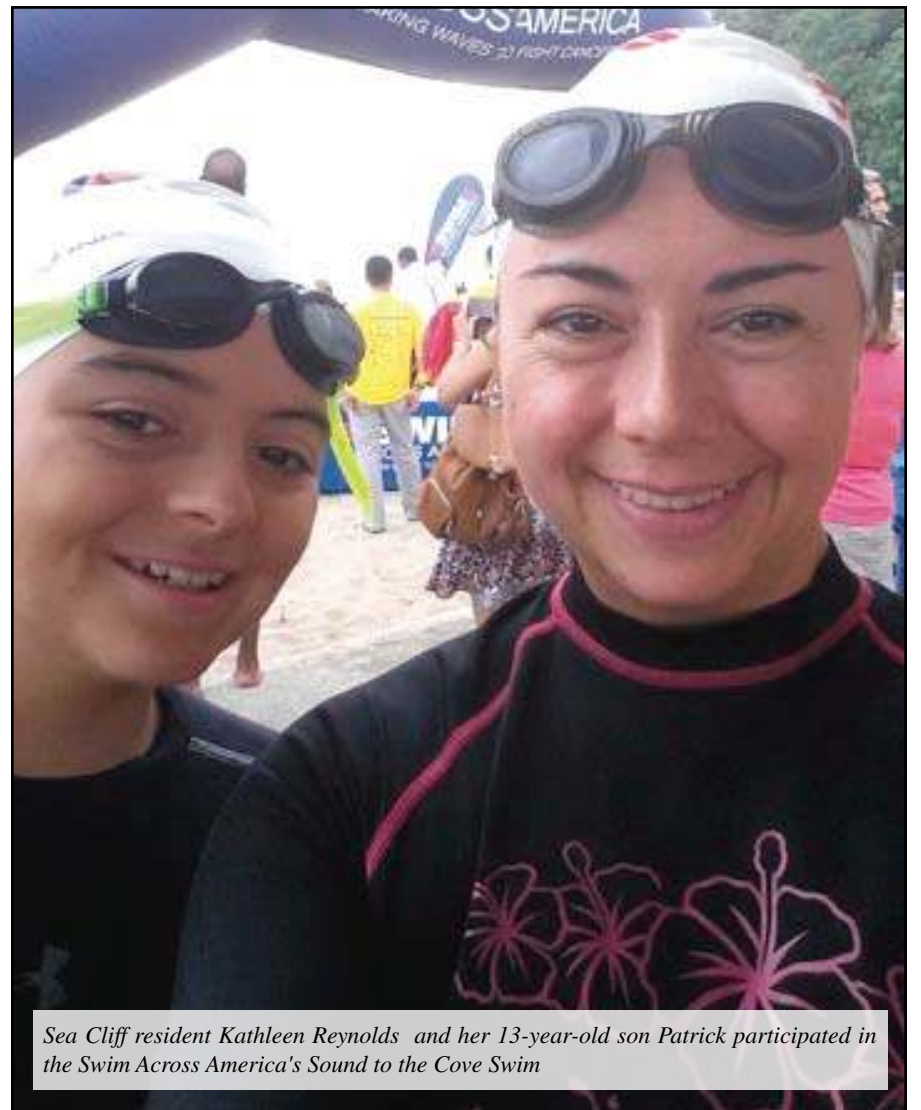
After over 20 years of planning and environmental remediation, the Garvies Point redevelopment project is poised to revitalize fifty two acres of blighted waterfront property. Garvies Point will create jobs, return blighted property back to the tax rolls and provide new public amenities for the entire community to enjoy.

## Local Mom/ Son Team Participate in "Swim Across America"

Kathleen continued "This was our second year doing the swim, and being a part of this event is really special. It is so inspiring to meet cancer survivors who are thriving and giving back by swimming and volunteering for SAA! SAA is run mostly by volunteers, which enables it to pass 82 cents of every dollar donated directly to cancer research, prevention and treatment. Patrick raised in excess of \$1,000 goal, and was recognized as a "Wavemaker" at the swim! We trained for almost 2 months, swimming at 7AM three to four mornings a week to prepare for our 1/2 mile swim. Since the swim is not a race, we had a lot of fun during the swim, including singing Happy Birthday to one of our fellow swimmers at the halfway point!"

# Glen Cove's Single Stream Recycling Celebrates First Anniversary

## Mayor Spinello Credits Residents and Sanitation Team for 32% Increase

Since the launch of Single Stream Recycling in August of last year, the City of Glen Cove has seen an increase of over 32% in recycled goods and a decrease in the tonnage of the City's Municipal Solid Waste. "Thanks to the enthusiasm of our residents and the commitment from our Sanitation team, the City has saved over \$120,000 by keeping items out of the waste stream and contributing them to our recycling program," said Mayor Spinello.

"Our success can be attributed to the outstanding program adoption by our community, the personalized service and outreach provided by the Glen Cove recycling and sanitation team and a successful public education and marketing program that promoted the convenience of our 'All In. One Bin.' approach," said James Byrne, Director, Glen Cove Public Works Department. "I appreciated the efforts of Sanitation Supervisor Doug Poncet and his staff and Recycling Coordinator Stephanie Soter for their diligence in promoting the benefits and measuring the effectiveness of Single Stream Recycling."

To maintain the momentum, Glen Cove's Sanitation team will continue their community outreach programs at local Glen Cove events (e.g., Kid's Play Day, National Night Out, Downtown Sounds, Morgan Park Summer Music Festival) by distributing fact sheets, instructions and free reusable grocery bags. This fall the department looks forward to working with the Glen Cove School District and the Youth Bureau's After Three program to teach children about the benefits and ease of Single Stream Recycling.

In addition to the outstanding performance of the Single Stream Recycling program, the City has also seen an increase in the recycling and disposal of specialized items during their bi-annual E-

Waste, S.T.O.P. (Stop Throwing Out Pollutants) and annual Christmas Tree mulching program sponsored by the Glen Cove Beautification Commission.

"Single Stream recycling is just one part of the City's effort to adopt greener and more energy efficient best practices," said Mr. Byrne. "After Labor Day, solar panels will be installed at the Glen Cove Volunteer Fire Department and the Glen Cove Senior Center and the City continues to replace traditional lighting with LED lights at City facilities and parking garages."

enamel, oil and lead-based paints only (no water or latex based paints), paint thinner, household batteries (no rechargeable batteries), brake and transmission fluid, antifreeze, aerosol cans with contents, air conditioning refrigerants, pesticides, insecticides, fertilizers, oven cleaner, rug cleaner, polish and wood preservatives, pool chemicals, propane tanks with contents, unused flammable liquids, and light bulbs.

\*NOT ELIGIBLE: Water and Latex based paints, electronics, car batteries, rechargeable batteries, motor oil, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, fireworks. No explosives or medical waste.\*

# SummerStrings Bows to Women of Rock

It is one thing to think about an orchestra playing with a rock band. It is another to experience it. "It's like being in the ocean with the waves lifting you up and setting you down," explains Nini Camps, lead singer of the all-female band Antigone Rising. "The sheer number of stringed instruments played by living, breathing, feeling humans creates an energy unlike any other stage experience. Sometimes you just want to sit in the middle and let the music wash over and through you."

The full house of Tilles Center's Hillwood Recital Hall on August 3 felt that musical tide during Matthew Schneider's fourth annual SummerStrings! Music Festival concert. Schneider directed two student orchestras—Sea Cliff Stringers, which included kids in grades 1 through 4, and the Rockestra, made up mainly of kids in grades 5 and up.

Sea Cliff's Jenn Gerrity sang and played guitar on one song with the Stringers and students Caralina Volz and Caroline Winchester closed the set singing a rousing rendition of "Funkytown." Camps and bandmate Cathy Henderson sang two of their songs with the Rockestra. Professional musicians Frank Ferrara, Dan Zellan and James Guarnieri accompanied both orchestras, including the Rockestra on Schneider's arrangement of Led Zeppelin's "Black Dog." "It sounded so good," praises Camps. "I was moved by how these kids were creating such lush orchestrations at such a young age, and wondered how my own musical journey might have been impacted if there were a SummerStrings! for me when I was in



third grade!"

Collaborating with other artists was an early festival goal for Schneider, who is also a professional musician and teaches private music lessons year-round through his business, Sea Cliff Music. This is the first year that the festival included vocal performances. "For most kids, orchestral music is completely separate from the music that they and their parents listen to," Schneider explains. "By performing alongside professionals, the kids become equal partners in putting on a real show that is both musically sophisticated and more closely related to their own musical vernacular. The singers convey the story of the song, the rock band provides the rhythmic foundation and the orchestra brings the lush color of strings." The combination sounded incredibly powerful and modern, but

Schneider says his greatest reward was hearing from parents "about how the kids came away from this experience lit up and inspired!"

At this year's concert, Schneider and the seven festival teachers performed two classical pieces, by Beethoven and Bach. "The kids love to see us rock out on stringed instruments and that opens their minds to new possibilities beyond the tradition," says Schneider. "However, it's also important for the kids to see us play the classics to understand that our love for and rigorous study of great historical works provides the musical foundation. I want the kids to experience and be open to all music!"

Schneider is donating proceeds from concert DVD sales to Antigone Rising's educational foundation, Girls Rising. The foundation creates programs that

inspire kids, including LGBT youth, through live performances, presentations and workshops.

But the best way to appreciate the energy and excitement of Schneider's orchestral experience is to see it live. Select members of the Rockestra will join Antigone Rising at the band's 3rd Annual BeachFest at Sea Cliff Beach on September 17. "The partnership between SummerStrings! and Antigone Rising has enabled our kids to perform with a truly great rock n roll band while also helping to fund educational opportunities through Girls Rising," says Schneider. "This is all about doing great things in the world while making great music. It doesn't get better than that!"

## Barry Rivadue Presentation on J.P. Morgan at NSHM

North Shore Historical Museum board member Barry Rivadue recently gave a very well received presentation at the museum on the life of J.P. Morgan. Board member Linda Darby, chairman of the lecture series of events, introduced Rivadue.

Dressed as J.P. himself, Barry Rivadue included the attempted assassination of Morgan, in 1915, at his home on East Island, Glen Cove, which is locally known as Morgan's Island.

The assailant, Eric Meunter, was held in the courthouse jail in the museum, which was for former courthouse building. The room was filled with guests as Rivadue made his power point presentation.

The museum was built in 1907 as the Oyster Bay City Hall, but when Glen Cove split from the Town of Oyster Bay and became a city in 1918 the building became the courthouse and police station for Glen Cove.

In more recent history the building had been

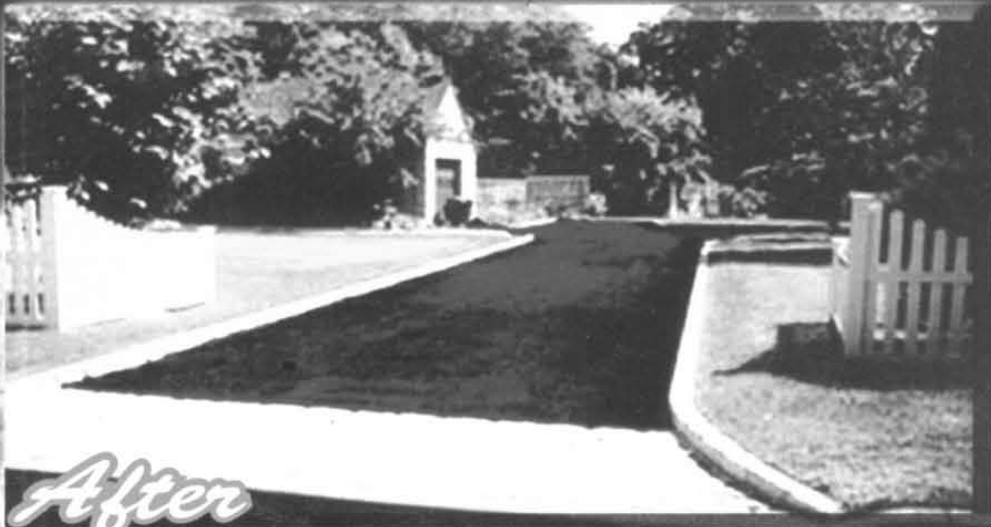
empty and in disrepair for many years, until a group of concerned citizens got together to raise the funds, through grants and fundraising events, to restore the building as the North Shore Historical Museum. It took more than fifteen years to raise the money and completely

restore the interior, before the museum officially opened in 2013.

## **To The Editor,**

Here I am again, that 4 feet 11 guy who rolls all over town, back with words to amuse you – or maybe not.

I am disturbed by the social media rhetoric in our community. Glen Cove is the place that we have chosen to live. We buy our groceries here and fill up our gas tanks here, and we all have the same 11542 zip code. Our community is probably not different from a lot of others on Long Island or even nationwide. No one likes change but nothing can stay the same or else it becomes stagnant without growth. Towns have died. My wife's father was born in 1921 in a town in upstate New York that no longer exists.

It is unfortunate that social media allows us to express feelings in an unnatural way, but that means of communicating seems like it is here to stay. I have a full-time job in the health care field providing services for possibly for your immediate family member, child or neighbor. I don't have time to read social media comments from 7 AM until 5:30 pm every week day. But if I were to make a comment, for example on Facebook before I left the house, by the time I pull out of the driveway for work, my comment could have been "liked" by over 20+ people with no opportunity for me to reply until 5:45 pm. In Glen Cove probably only 5% of its residents are involved with social media. Even with that low percentage I am shocked how many people are sued for their comments, blocked from viewing other postings and pages all because their opinions conflicted with the original posting comment, and then become harassed for their own opinions. Social media is the "chicken way out" of dealing with a problem. What has happened to "love thy neighbor", and to "can't we all get along"? Is Freedom of Speech only for a designated few in Glen Cove?

I am concerned that no one wants to listen to the other side of the story and their sole news source may be the incomplete facts published in black and white by a biased journalist. Remember that phrase from A Few Good Men (1992) "You want truth? You can't handle the truth." There are people now that just don't want to listen to the truth and hide behind their own personal agendas, which lately have become not so hidden.

I lost the election in 2015 to become a Glen Cove City Councilman but I still want to do what is right for Glen Cove. People do cross party lines to vote for whom they feel will represent them legally and ethically. I have friends on both sides of the political aisles. Both a Republican and Democrat have told me that there are no true political parties here in Glen Cove, just people that either

*To make toasts: Prepare grill or preheat broiler. With a serrated knife cut bread crosswise into 1/2-inch-thick slices. Combine the oil and garlic together and spread it on one side of the cut bread.*

*Arrange bread slices in one layer in a shallow baking pan and bake in middle of oven until golden, about 10 minutes.*

*In a bowl toss together watermelon, cheese, chives, mint, vinegar, and salt and pepper to taste and mound about 1 tablespoon on oiled side of each toast.*

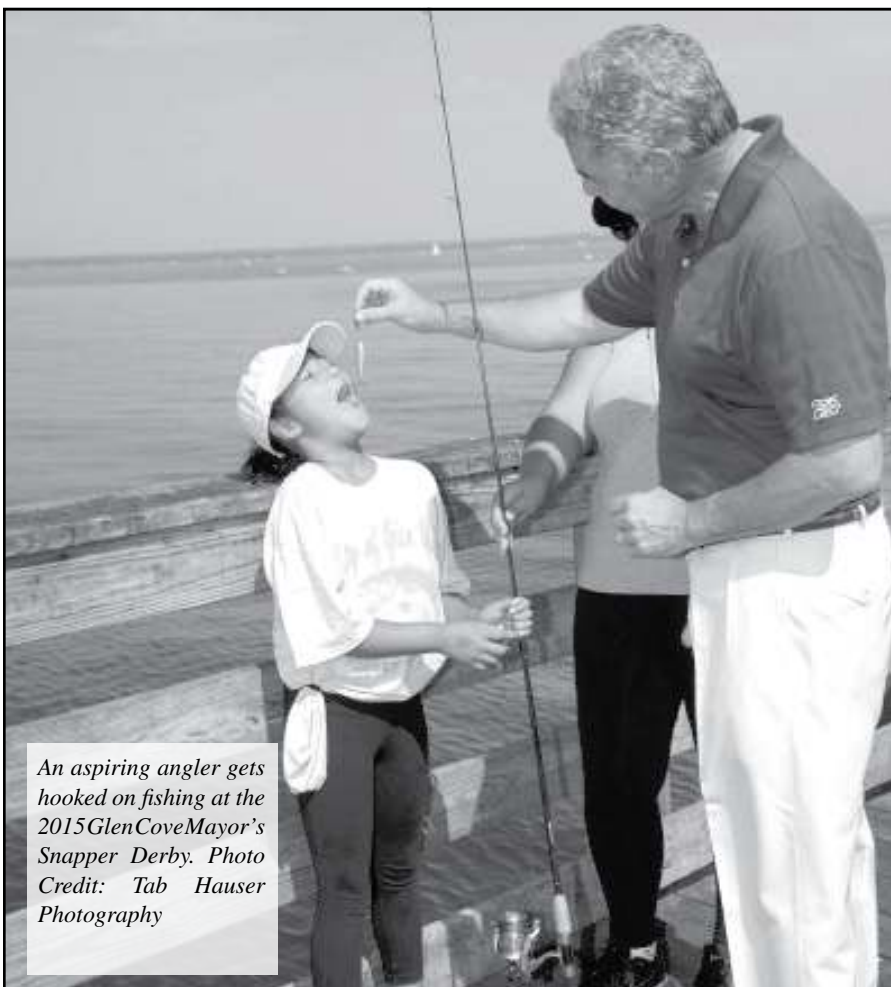
